Perhaps you have imagined yourself as one of the figures in the nativity scene. I hope that you have a desire to be a little like some of them.

Perhaps, you see yourself as one of the shepherds who were out at night tending their flocks. They were watchful, awake, and after listening to the angel's message, immediately departing to go to find the little child, the Son of God. Or maybe you want to be like one of the three wise men, who with much learning set out with great interest and some gifts in search of this child, this special child, who is the Son of God and yet so small. Maybe some of you want to be like St. Joseph, Mary's husband and Jesus' adopted father, who took care of him, guarded him, and protected him in the first years of his life. I ask you to be witnesses of the Gospel of joy, peace, friendship and fraternity that Jesus taught us.

I invite you to continue to proclaim the Good News to every family. May the Lord accompany you in these days in your activities with which you collaborate and promote the Missionary Childhood founded by Monsignor Charles de Forbin Janson, who was concerned about children who were dying without knowing Jesus.

Even today, many children die in many parts of the world. As young missionaries, as disciples of Jesus, we have the responsibility to pray and act so that everyone can live in dignity.
